

### Description

The Boost power modules are non-isolated dc-dc converters that can deliver up to 65W of output power. The module can operate over a wide range of input voltage ( $V_{IN} = 8V_{dc} - 16V_{dc}$ ) and provide an adjustable 16 to  $34V_{DC}$  output. The output voltage is programmable via an external resistor. Features include remote On/Off, over current and over temperature protection. The module also includes the Tunable Loop<sup>TM</sup> feature that allows the user to optimize the dynamic response of the converter to match the load with reduced amount of output capacitance leading to savings on cost and PWB area.




Figure 1. Converter Efficiency versus output current




Figure 2. Derating Output Current versus Ambient Temperature and Airflow,  $V_{\text{IN}}$  = 10V




Figure 3. Typical output ripple ( $C_0=66\mu F$  ceramic,  $V_{IN}=12V$ ,  $I_0=I_{o,\ max}$ )




Figure 4. Transient Response to Dynamic Load Change from 50% to 100% at 12V $_{\text{IN}}$ , Cout= 3x10uF+220uF, CTune=6800pF, RTune=30.1 $\Omega$ 




Figure 5. Typical Start-up Using On/Off Voltage ( $I_o = I_{o, max}$ )




Figure 6. Typical Start-up Using Input Voltage (VIN = 12V, Io = Io, max)




Figure 7. Converter Efficiency versus output current




Figure 8. Derating Output Current versus Ambient Temperature and Airflow, V<sub>IN</sub>=12V




Figure 9. Typical output ripple  $(C_0=66\mu F \text{ ceramic}, V_{IN}=12V, I_0=I_{0, max})$ 




Figure 10. Transient Response to Dynamic Load Change from 50 % to 100% at 12V $_{IN}$ , Cout = 3x10uF+220uF, CTune=3300pF, RTune=30.1k $\Omega$ 




Figure 11. Typical Start-up Using On/Off Voltage (Io = Io, max)




Figure 12. Typical Start-up Using Input Voltage (VIN = 12V, Io = Io, max)




Figure 13. Converter Efficiency versus output current




Figure 14. Derating Output Current versus Ambient Temperature and Airflow.  $V_{\text{IN}}$  = 12V




Figure 15. Typical output ripple ( $C_0$ =66 $\mu$ F ceramic,  $V_{IN}$  = 12V,  $I_0$  =  $I_{o, max}$ )




Figure 16. Transient Response to Dynamic Load Change from 50% to 100% at 12V $_{in}$ , Cou $_{to}$  = 9x10uF, CTune=3300pF, RTune=30.1 $\Omega$ 




Figure 17. Typical Start-up Using On/Off Voltage (I<sub>o</sub> = I<sub>o, max</sub>)




Figure 18. Typical Start-up Using Input Voltage (V<sub>IN</sub> = 12V, I<sub>o</sub> = I<sub>o,max</sub>)




Figure 19. Converter Efficiency versus output current




Figure 20. Derating Output Current versus Ambient Temperature and Airflow.  $V_{\text{IN}}$  = 12V




Figure 21. Typical output ripple and noise  $(C_0=66\mu F \text{ ceramic}, V_{IN}=12V, I_o=I_{o, max})$ 




Figure 22. Transient Response to Dynamic Load Change from 0.9 to 1.9A at  $12V_{IN}$ ,  $C_{OUT}=9x10uF$  CTune=1000pF, RTune=30.1 $\Omega$ 




Figure 23. Typical Start-up Using On/Off Voltage ( $I_o = I_{o, max}$ )




Figure 24. Typical Start-up Using Input Voltage (V<sub>IN</sub> = 12V, I<sub>o</sub> = I<sub>o, max</sub>)



### **Design Considerations**

### Input Filtering

The ABXS002 Open Frame module should be connected to a low ac-impedance source. A highly inductive source can affect the stability of the module. An input capacitance must be placed directly adjacent to the input pin of the module, to minimize input ripple voltage and ensure module stability.




Figure 25. Input ripple voltage. Input voltage is 12V. Scope BW

To minimize input voltage ripple, ceramic capacitors are recommended at the input of the module. Figure 25 shows the input ripple voltage.

#### **Output Filtering**

These modules are designed for low output ripple voltage and will meet the maximum output ripple specification with 66uF ceramic capacitors at the output of the module. However, additional output filtering may be required by the system designer for a number of reasons. First, there may be a need to further reduce the output ripple and noise of the module. Second, the dynamic response characteristics may need to be customized to a particular load step change.




Figure 26. Output ripple voltage. input voltage is 12V. Scope BW Limited to 20MHz

To reduce the output ripple and improve the dynamic response to a step load change, additional capacitance at the output can be used. Low ESR polymer and ceramic capacitors are recommended to improve the dynamic response of the module. Figure 26 provides output ripple information, measured with a scope with its Bandwidth limited to 20MHz for different external capacitance values at various Vo. For stable operation of the module, limit the capacitance to less than the maximum output capacitance as specified in the electrical specification table. Optimal performance of the module can be achieved by using

the Tunable Loop<sup>TM</sup> feature described later in this data sheet.

### **Safety Considerations**

For safety agency approval the power module must be installed in compliance with the spacing and separation requirements of the end-use safety agency standards, i.e., UL ANSI/UL 62368-1 and CAN/CSA C22.2 No. 62368-1 Recognized, DIN VDE0868-1/A11:2017 (EN62368-1:2014/A11:2017).

For the converter output to be considered meeting the Requirements of safety extra-low voltage (SELV) or ESI, the input must meet SELV/ESI requirements. The power module has extra-low voltage (ELV) outputs when all inputs are ELV.

The input to these units is to be provided with a 12A fuse in the positive input lead.



### **Analog Feature Descriptions**

#### Remote On/Off

The ABXS002 Open Frame power modules feature an On/Off pin for remote On/Off operation.




Figure 27. Circuit configuration for using negative On/Off logic.

For negative logic On/Off modules, the circuit configuration is shown in Fig. 27. The On/Off pin should be pulled high with an external pull-up resistor. When Q1 turns On, the On/OFF pin is pulled low. This turns Q2 off and the internal PWM Enable is pulled high and the module turns on. When Q1 is Off, Q2 turns ON and the internal PWM Enable is pulled low and the module turns OFF.

#### Monotonic Start-up and Shutdown

The module has monotonic start-up and shutdown behavior for any combination of rated input voltage, output current and operating temperature range.

### Startup into Pre-biased Output

The module can start into a prebiased output as long as the prebias voltage is 0.5V less than the set output voltage.

### **Analog Output Voltage Programming**

The output voltage of each output of the module can be programmable to any voltage from 16VDC to 34VDC by connecting a resistor between the Trims and GND pins of the module.




Figure 28. Circuit configuration for programming output voltage using an external resistor

Without an external resistor between TRIM and sGND pins, each output of the module will be the same as input voltage. The value of the trim resistor, Rtrim for a desired output voltage, should be as per the following equation:

 $R_{\text{trim}}$  is the external resistor in  $k\Omega$  Vo is the desired output voltage.

Table 1 provides R<sub>trim</sub> values required for some common output voltages.

#### **Analog Voltage Margining**

Output voltage margining can be implemented in the module by connecting a resistor, R<sub>margin-up</sub>, from the Trim pin to the ground pin for margining-up the output voltage and by connecting a resistor, R<sub>margin-down</sub>, from the Trim pin to output pin for margining-down. Figure 30 shows the circuit configuration for output voltage margining. The POL Programming Tool, available at omnionpower.com under the Downloads section, also calculates the values of R<sub>margin-up</sub> and R<sub>margin-down</sub> for a specific output voltage and % margin. Please consult your local OmniOn technical representative for additional details

#### **Overcurrent Protection**

To provide protection in a fault (output overload) condition, the unit is equipped with internal current-limiting circuitry and can endure current limiting continuously. At the point of current-limit inception, the unit enters hiccup mode. The unit operates normally once the output current is brought back into its specified range.

### **Overtemperature Protection**

To provide protection in a fault condition, the unit is equipped with a thermal shutdown circuit. The unit will shut down if the over-temperature threshold of  $129^{\circ}$ C (typ) is exceeded at the thermal reference point  $T_{\text{ref}}$ . Once the unit goes into thermal shutdown it will then wait to cool before attempting to restart.

#### Input Undervoltage Lockout

At input voltages below the input undervoltage lockout limit, the module operation is disabled. The module will begin to operate at an input voltage above the undervoltage lockout turn-on threshold.

### Tunable Loop™

The module has a feature that optimizes transient response of the module called Tunable Loop<sup>TM</sup>.

External capacitors are usually added to the output of the module for two reasons: to reduce output ripple and noise (see Figure 26) and to reduce output voltage deviations from the steady-state value in the presence of dynamic load current changes. Adding external capacitance however affects the voltage control loop of the module, typically causing the loop to slow down with sluggish response. Larger values of

external capacitance could also cause the module to become unstable.




Figure. 31. Circuit diagram showing connection of  $R_{\text{TUNE}}$  and  $C_{\text{TUNE}}$  to tune the control loop of the module.

The Tunable Loop<sup>TM</sup> allows the user to externally adjust the voltage control loop to match the filter network connected to the output of the module. The Tunable Loop<sup>TM</sup> is implemented by connecting a series R-C between the VOUT and TRIM pins of the module, as shown in Fig. 31. This R-C allows the user to externally adjust the voltage loop feedback compensation of the module.

Recommended values of  $R_{\text{TUNE}}$  and  $C_{\text{TUNE}}$  for different output capacitor combinations are given in Tables 2. Table 2 shows the recommended values of  $R_{\text{TUNE}}$  and  $C_{\text{TUNE}}$  for different values of ceramic output capacitors up to 30X01uF that might be needed for an application to meet output ripple and noise requirements. Selecting  $R_{\text{TUNE}}$  and  $C_{\text{TUNE}}$  according to Table 2 will ensure stable operation of the module.

In applications with tight output voltage limits in the presence of dynamic current loading, additional output capacitance will be required. Table 3 lists recommended values of R<sub>TUNE</sub> and C<sub>TUNE</sub> in order to meet 2% output voltage deviation limits for some common output voltages in presence of a 50% step change (50% of full load), with an input voltage of 12V.

Please contact your OmniOn Power technical representative to obtain more details of this feature as well as for guidelines on how to select the right value of external R-C to tune the module for best transient performance and stable operation for other output capacitance values.

#### **Power Good**

The module provides a Power Good (PGOOD) signal that is implemented with an open-drain output to indicate that the output voltage is within the regulation limits of the power module. The PGOOD signal will be de-asserted to a low state if any condition such as overtemperature, overcurrent or loss of regulation occurs that would result in the output voltage going outside the specified thresholds.

The PGOOD terminal can be connected through a pullup resistor (suggested value  $10 \text{K}\Omega$ ) to a source of 5VDC or lower.



#### Thermal Considerations

Power modules operate in a variety of thermal environments; however, sufficient cooling should always be provided to help ensure reliable operation.




Figure 32. Thermal Test Setup.




Figure 33. Preferred airflow direction and location of hot-spot of the module  $(T_{\rm ref})$ .

Considerations include ambient temperature, airflow, module power dissipation, and the need for increased reliability. A reduction in the operating temperature of the module will result in an increase in reliability. The thermal data presented here is based on physical measurements taken in a wind tunnel. The test set-up is shown in Figure 32. The preferred airflow direction for the module is in Figure 33.

The thermal reference points,  $T_{ref}$  used in the specifications are also shown in Figure 33. For reliable operation the temperatures at the Q1 should not exceed 120°C. The output power of the module should not exceed the rated power of the module ( $V_{o,set} \times I_{o,max}$ ).

Please refer to the Application Note "Thermal Characterization Process For Open-Frame Board Mounted Power Modules" for a detailed discussion of thermal aspects including maximum device temperatures.

### **Heat Transfer via Conduction**




Figure 34. Output Current versus ColdWall Temperature;  $V_{\text{IN}}$  =12V.

The module can also be used in a sealed environment with cooling via conduction from the module's top surface through a gap pad material to a coldwall, as shown below. The output current derating versus coldwall temperature, when using a thermal pad and a gap filler is shown in Figure 34



#### Surface Mount Information

#### Pick and Place

The ABXS002 Open Frame modules use an open frame construction and are designed for a fully automated assembly process. The modules are fitted with a label designed to provide a large surface area for pick and place operations. The label meets all the requirements for surface mount processing, as well as safety standards, and is able to withstand reflow temperatures of up to 300°C. The label also carries product information such as product code, serial number and the location of manufacture.

#### **Nozzle Recommendations**

Stencil thickness of 6 mils minimum must be used for this product. The module weight has been kept to a minimum by using open frame construction. Variables such as nozzle size, tip style, vacuum pressure and placement speed should be considered to optimize this process. The minimum recommended inside nozzle diameter for reliable operation is 3mm. The maximum nozzle outer diameter, which will safely fit within the allowable component spacing, is 7 mm.

#### **Bottom Side / First Side Assembly**

This module is not recommended for assembly on the bottom side of a customer board. If such an assembly is attempted, components may fall off the module during the second reflow process.

#### Lead Free Soldering

The modules are lead-free (Pb-free) and RoHS compliant and fully compatible in a Pb-free soldering process. Failure to observe the instructions below may result in the failure of or cause damage to the modules and can adversely affect long-term reliability.

#### **Pb-free Reflow Profile**




Figure 35. Recommended linear reflow profile using Sn/Ag/Cu solder.

Power Systems will comply with J-STD-020 Rev. D (Moisture/Reflow Sensitivity Classification for Nonhermetic Solid State Surface Mount Devices) for both Pb-free solder profiles and MSL classification procedures. This standard provides a recommended forced-air-convection reflow profile based on the volume and thickness of the package (table 4-2). The suggested Pb-free solder paste is Sn/Ag/Cu (SAC). The recommended linear reflow profile using Sn/Ag/Cu (SAC) solder is shown in Fig. 35. Soldering outside of the recommended profile requires testing to verify results and performance.

#### MSL Rating

The ABXS002 modules have a MSL rating of 2a.

#### Storage and Handling

The recommended storage environment and handling procedures for moisture-sensitive surface mount packages is detailed in J-STD-033 Rev. A (Handling, Packing, Shipping and Use of Moisture/ Reflow Sensitive Surface Mount Devices). Moisture barrier bags (MBB) with desiccant are required for MSL ratings of 2 or greater. These sealed packages should not be broken until time of use. Once the original package is broken, the floor life of the product at conditions of  $\leq$  30°C and 60% relative humidity varies according to the MSL rating (see J-STD-033A). The shelf life for dry packed SMT packages will be a minimum of 12 months from the bag seal date, when stored at the following conditions: < 40°C, < 90% relative humidity.

#### Post Solder Cleaning and Drying Considerations

Post solder cleaning is usually the final circuit-board assembly process prior to electrical board testing. The result of inadequate cleaning and drying can affect both the reliability of a power module and the testability of the finished circuit-board assembly. For guidance on appropriate soldering, cleaning and drying procedures, refer to Board Mounted Power Modules: Soldering and Cleaning Application Note (ANO4-001).
